Industrial Visit Report.

BAMMC Department of the J.V.M.'s Degree College, organized an Industrial visit of Media students between 5th February to 10th February 2023, at Chandigarh- Amritsar. The tour operator was Mr. Chandan Mishra from Shivalaya Holiday. The tour journey started from Panvel -Navi Mumbai by Goa samperk Kranti at 11 am on 5th February and reached Chandigarh by 11 a.m. on 6th Feb. The troop reached Hotel Classic by 12.30 P.M. on 6th February. After the hotel room allocation, students had lunch, by 3 p.m., the student group left for Chandigarh sightseeing, which included- Pinjore Garden, Rock Garden, and Sukhna Lake, students observed and were fascinated by the great creativity of the rock garden. Also came to know the legacy of Shri Nek Chand, the creator of Rock Garden. In the evening students were given free time for shopping in Chandigarh. The next day -on 7th February, after having breakfast, the group left for an industrial visit at Tribune News Paper Mill, where students were exposed to the newspaper printing process and were told- ' how paper plates are manufactured and RGB color combinations are set in the computer for printing the newspaper. The authority of the Tribune newspaper Mill- Mr. Aman Gulathi and Mr. Sushil Tiwari, Mr. Karamveer, Sr. Manager, told the History of Tribune newspaper, this newspaper was started by Sardar Dyal Singh Majithia in the year 1881, in Lahore- presently in Pakistan, for helping Indian citizens and freedom fighters. Students came to know that - The Tribune newspaper is the only newspaper of its kind, which is run on its own, Tribune trustees do not take any financial aid from any Government agencies, hence it is self -financed organization. The second industrial visit took place at the local newspaper- 'Arthprakash', (Print media and online subscription channel). Shri Mahavir Jain, (The proprietor of Arthprakah newspaper shared key points with students about- how to be a good news reporter and how to collect worthy news from various news sources. After this, we proceeded to Amritsar. IV group reached Amritsar- 'The Cabana Hotel', at 9 PM.



On 8th February, after lunch students group visited the Historical place- The Wagah Boarder, and enjoyed India -the Pakistan evening flag ceremony, (Lowering of the flags ceremony at the Atari- Wagah border is a daily routine by Central Armed Police Force) practiced that the security forces of India (Border Security Force -BSF) and Pakistan (Pakistan Rangers) which have been jointly followed since 1959. This parade is a symbol of the two countries' rivalry and a display of brotherhood and cooperation between the two Nations. Students were moved by patriotic tunes by chanting – "Bande Mataram, Bharat Mata Kii Jai", more than 1000 people joined this parade, and the whole surrounding was enshrined with patriotic songs, dance, and loud slogans, each one of us was touched with BSF soldiers dedication and sacrifice towards the country, everyone was moved with the proud feeling of being an Indian Citizen. After the flag ceremony got over students reached to Hotel room, being the last night of IV, students enjoyed a DJ party organized by the tour operator.

On 9th February, after breakfast IV group visited Jallianwala Bagh, close to the Golden Temple at Amritsar, Punjab. Where India is preserved in the memory of freedom fighters those wounded and killed in the Jallianwala Bagh Massacre that took place on 13th April 1919. Students observed various sights of the Jallianwala Bagh, the remains of bullets on the wall, and the well, where people jumped for escaping their lives. Students were touched by freedom fighters' struggle and sacrifice.

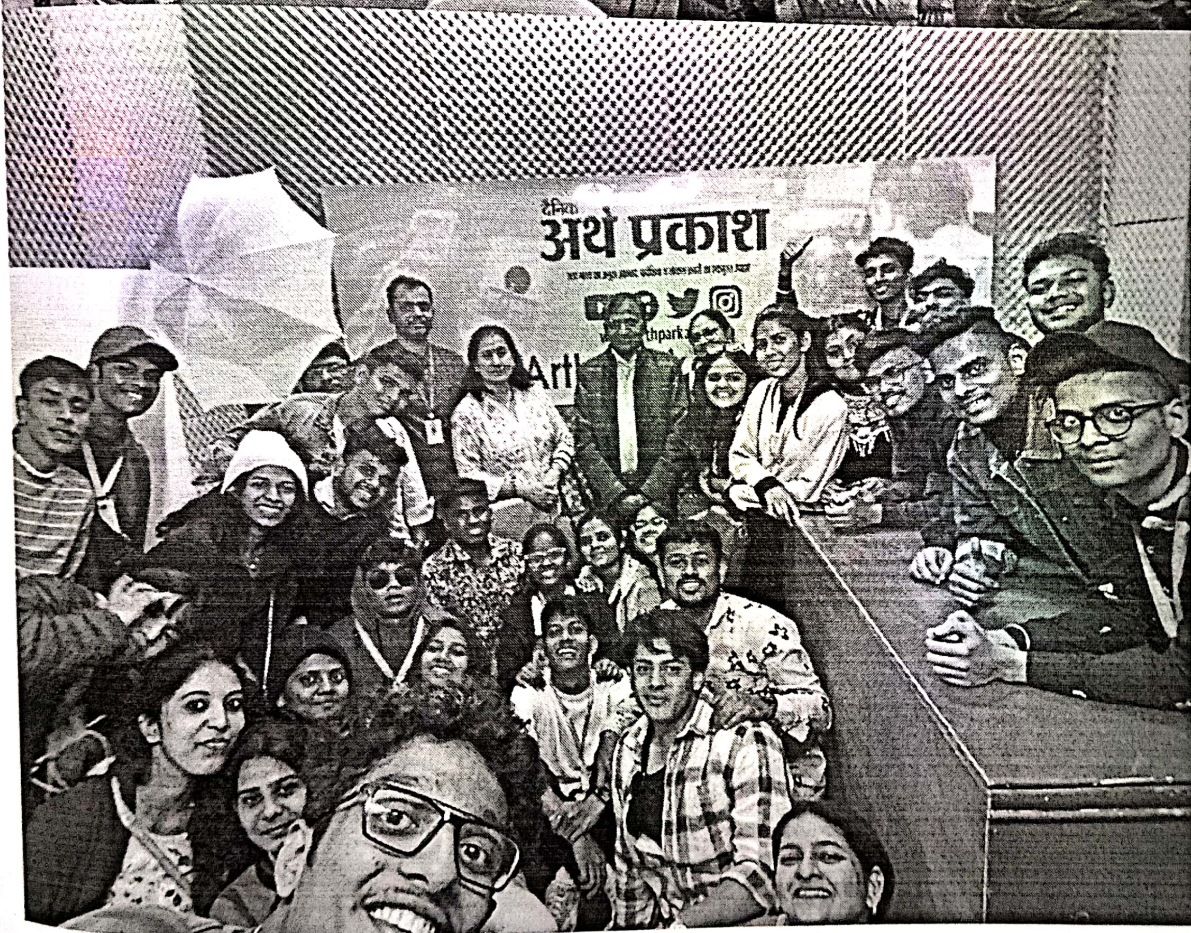
