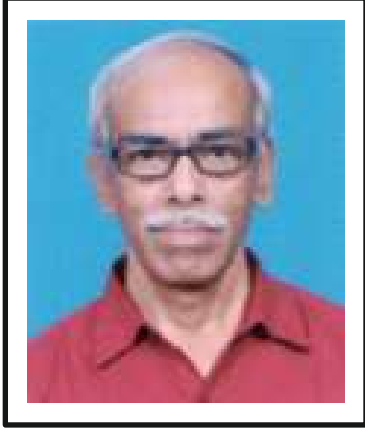

The Principal's Report 2024-25

With great pleasure, I present this report, which reflects the academic progress, achievements, and collective efforts of our institution. “Horizon” is a creative and academic chronicle of our college, and stands as a testimony to learning, innovation and expression beyond the classroom.

I express my sincere gratitude to the Management, which, with a strong foundation and a clear vision, has always continued to inspire us. Under their stewardship, every initiative undertaken to enhance academics, infrastructure, and extracurricular activities was always consistent and full-fledged, inspiring both students and faculty.

Our college has consistently strived to uphold academic excellence by fostering a learner-centric environment. We are proud to acknowledge that the International Conference on “*Navigating the Convergence: Exploring Innovative Strategies in Commerce, Management, and Media*” on 31st August, 2024 with 57 research papers from different corners, was a milestone for our academics.

Department Activities

The academic departments functioned as dynamic centres of learning, fostering innovation, creativity, and intellectual engagement among students. A wide range of activities were conducted, including innovative projects, PowerPoint presentations, knowledge-based quizzes, group discussions, debates, speeches, short films, documentaries, photographic storytelling, voice modulation exercises, critical reviews, and other experiential learning activities.

To strengthen academic foundations and ensure a smooth transition into the curriculum, all departments proactively introduced bridge courses and certificate programs at the beginning of the academic year. These initiatives enhanced subject understanding, skill development, and student confidence.

Various departments of the college organised a wide range of academic, skill-based, and career-oriented activities throughout the year. These included seminars, expert and alumni talks, workshops, certificate courses, competitions, awareness campaigns, field visits, and celebrations of important national and international days. The initiatives focused on enhancing subject knowledge,

Committee Activities

Our college committees conducted various activities, where students actively participated to frame their career and personality development.

The NSS and DLLE units actively collaborated to promote social responsibility, civic awareness, and community engagement among students. Through initiatives such as International Peace Day and Yoga Day celebrations, *Viksit Bharat*-themed activities, awareness programmes, and community outreach visits, students developed an understanding of inclusiveness and social consciousness. Activities, workshops, cleanliness drives, and cloth distribution strengthened community service. The NSS unit also organised disaster management training, awareness programmes, rallies, seminars on law and cybersecurity, a Merustamb event, and a Mega Tree Plantation, as well as a Blood Donation camp in collaboration with Jaslok Hospital, collecting 50 units of blood on 29th August, 2024. The NSS team even organised the 10-day camp in Kolam village, near Morbad. contributing significantly to students' holistic development.

The Red Ribbon Club organised HIV/AIDS awareness sessions and rallies, a Youth Awareness Programme on National Youth Day, and a short film screening. The Women Development Cell conducted seminars on Cyber Security in association with the Maharashtra State Commission for Women, along with an elocution competition on Savitribai Phule's birth anniversary and sessions on personality development, grooming, menstrual hygiene, and body language. The Competitive Examination Guidance Cell organised sessions on civil service examinations and skill development, guiding students on exam preparation, study strategies, resource selection, and motivation, along with intra- and intercollegiate activities.

The Students' Council organised *Jashn – String Fest*, an intra-collegiate cultural event featuring literary and fine arts competitions that showcased students' creativity. The intercollegiate sports fest, *Udaan*, promoted sportsmanship and unity through various indoor and outdoor games with the participation of 391 students. *Aarsh – The Media Fest* witnessed enthusiastic participation from 12 colleges and 238 students in diverse media and performing arts competitions. *Panorama*, a multidisciplinary cultural fest, brought together 24 colleges for cultural and team-based events with a remarkable turnout of 1,054 participants. The *Sci-Tech* mega event involved 13 colleges, highlighting scientific and creative skills through poster presentations, slogans, and eco-friendly activities.

Our Junior College Activities

Our Junior College conducted an orientation program and training session for young voters on how to use the EVM machine and an awareness rally, a seminar on competitive exam preparation, Swatchata Abhiyan, Majhi Vasundhara, Har Ghar Tiranga, Nav Bharat Sakharta Abhiyan Program, a seminar on the Aviation Industry and Company Secretarial Practice.

In collaboration with the Degree College, many events were conducted for academic excellence. Marathi Vangmay Mandal programs and intercollegiate competitions, Jashn, Goonj, Udaan, and Samvidhan Divas (Constitution Day) were also organised.

On 14th December 2024, our college hosted an intercollegiate Science and Commerce Exhibition, on the themes Modern Recycling Technologies and Commercial Marketing Techniques, which attracted participation from several other colleges. The event showcased innovative projects and ideas from students across various institutions.

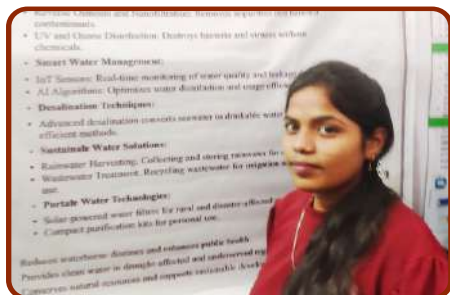

Department of Commerce Report 2024-25

- **Bridge Course:**

Bridge courses primarily aim to facilitate a smoother transition between different educational levels. They bridge the gap between existing student knowledge and the requirements of a new academic program, providing foundational understanding and skill development. This helps students feel more confident and prepared for their upcoming studies. The department has conducted bridge courses for second and third years of B. Com students where approximately 615 benefited from it.

Co-curricular and Extra Curricular activities.

- **Career Awareness Session on Company Secretary**

On 25th July 2024, a career awareness session on company secretary was organized by the Department of Commerce in collaboration with the Navi Mumbai Chapter of WIRC of ICSI. The session took place in the college seminar hall and was attended by 120 students. The session's resource person was CS Suvarna Joshi. The purpose of the session was to provide information about the company secretary professional course. This session was beneficial for the students who learned about the significance of CS courses in terms of admission, course pattern, fee structure, and career opportunities available after completing the CS course.

- **Study Tour- Sagunabag**

The Department of Commerce organized a study tour for commerce students to engage students in experiential learning on 29th July 2024. Students were taken to Saguna Bag – an environmentally friendly agricultural farm for the visit where 113 students have enthusiastically participated. During the visit, students were demonstrated honey bee farming, oil extraction, fishing, Pearl farming, and Poultry farming. It was beneficial for the students where it focussed on how Agricultural sustainable methods are practiced and rice cultivation methods were used for efficiency and sustainability. The students were educated on the importance of pest management in cultivation and how it can be maintained through traditional methods were also demonstrated. A variety of plants and their everyday uses were explained, and students were also taken on a petting animal tour to help them connect more closely with nature. The study tour provided valuable insights into sustainable farming practices, modern agricultural techniques, and employment opportunities for youth in rural communities. The skills and knowledge students gained extended beyond the classroom — fostering awareness of sustainable agriculture, environmental conservation, and active community participation.

- **Expert talk on 'Leading India to Growth – Budget 2024'**

The Department of Commerce organized a session titled “Leading India to Growth – Budget 2024” on 7th August 2024 to help students understand the Indian budget and the current economic landscape. Dr. Vikas Ubale, Economics Professor from BNN College, Bhiwandi, served as the keynote speaker. The event began with an address by Shri V.N. National Service Scheme (NSS) Report 2024-25

The NSS unit organized a 3-day Yoga Workshop from 20th to 22nd June 2024, in association with Patanjali Yog Sanstha. Mr. Vishal Agrawal, a yoga expert conducted the sessions, teaching yoga techniques for physical and mental well-being. The workshop was inaugurated by Dr. B. R. Deshpande and Mr. Sanjay Gupta, who also participated in the sessions. A total of 54 students attended, learning practical yoga practices to incorporate into daily life. The event successfully promoted holistic health, wellness, and the benefits of yoga among participants.

The NSS Unit, in collaboration with the Art of Living Foundation, conducted a Tree Plantation Drive on 30th June 2024. A total of 26 volunteers participated, planting saplings in the adopted locality over 4 hours. The activity aimed to promote environmental sustainability and enhance greenery. Students acquired knowledge about the role of trees in combating climate change and preserving biodiversity.

The drive successfully planted numerous trees and raised environmental awareness among over 100 local residents.

The NSS Unit collaborated with Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation for a Mangrove Cleaning Drive on 14th July 2024 at Sector 10, Airoli. A total of 10 volunteers participated, dedicating 3 hours to the eco-friendly initiative. They removed plastic waste and non-biodegradable items from the mangrove area to protect the coastal ecosystem. The drive successfully reduced environmental pollutants and promoted marine conservation.

The NSS Unit of JVM's Mehta Degree College conducted a Cloth Distribution Drive in the adopted area on March 18, 2025, with 11 volunteers participating. The activity aimed to support underprivileged individuals by providing essential clothing items. Volunteers ensured respectful and organized distribution while engaging positively with community members. Beneficiaries expressed gratitude, and volunteers felt fulfilled through their service. The initiative reinforced NSS values of empathy and community engagement, with plans for future similar activities.

The NSS Unit of JVM's Mehta Degree College, in collaboration with Jaslok Hospital, organized a Blood Donation Camp on 29th August, 2024. A total of 81 participants attended, including 68 male and 13 female students. Volunteers assisted with registration, guided donors, and supported the medical team during the 6-hour event. The camp successfully collected 50 blood units, contributing to the hospital's blood bank and saving lives. The activity promoted civic responsibility, teamwork, and health awareness among participants.

The NSS unit of JVM's Mehta Degree College conducted a Road Safety Awareness campaign on 27th September 2024 in collaboration with United Way. A total of 193 volunteers participated, including 80 male and 113 female students. United Way performed a skit highlighting essential road safety practices such as helmet use, seat belts, and traffic rules. Volunteers distributed pamphlets, interacted with the public, and demonstrated safe road behaviours during the 2-hour activity. The campaign successfully promoted road safety awareness and enabled volunteers to contribute meaningfully to community well-being.

The college organized a Diwali Faral Packing and Distribution initiative on 8th and 9th November 2024. A total of 19 participants packed traditional Diwali sweets and snacks on the first day. On the second day, 20 participants distributed the packed Faral to underprivileged families in Sector 20, Airoli. The activity promoted teamwork, community service, and festive generosity among students. The initiative successfully spread joy and reinforced the values of compassion and social engagement. The NSS team even organised the 10 days camp in Kolam village, near Morbad.

Lokamanya Tilak Municipal General Hospital (LTMG) had organized a Blood Donation Camp on December 7, 2024, to promote voluntary blood donation. A total of 50 NSS volunteers participated, assisting with donor registration and collection. Medical professionals conducted health check-ups to ensure donor eligibility, and donors received certificates of appreciation. The camp successfully collected 39 blood units, contributing to hospital blood supply. The initiative raised awareness about the importance of blood donation and encouraged a culture of voluntary contribution.

The Aga Khan Agency conducted a two-day Disaster Management Workshop from February 7–8, 2025, to train students in disaster preparedness and emergency response. A total of 52 participants attended the session. Experts covered key topics including types of disasters, early warning systems, evacuation procedures, and first aid. Students took part in interactive discussions, practical exercises, and scenario-based learning activities. The workshop effectively raised awareness and equipped students with essential life-saving skills for handling emergencies.

The college, in collaboration with the Giants Group of Dombivli, organized an Organ Donation Awareness Program on February 16, 2025. A total of 105 participants attended the informative session. Experts, including Dr. Kamal Jain, explained the medical, ethical, and legal aspects of organ donation. Students engaged in interactive discussions, gaining clarity on myths, procedures, and the life-saving impact of organ donation. The program successfully raised awareness and encouraged participants to consider pledging as organ donors.

A **total of 21 students** from all classes participated in the Competition.

Along with the Management Members, Principal, Teaching and non teaching staff also actively participated in the activity.

A field activity was organized to visit **old age home visit-Gurukul Care Centre**, Airoli on 21st August 2024, for the volunteers on the occasion of **World Senior Citizen Day** to develop sensitivity among students towards old people. Volunteers actively participated in the activity. They distributed fruits and biscuits, some groceries and adult diapers as per their requirements. The students even cut the cake and played some games with enthusiastic old people. Senior citizens from the old age home enjoyed it a lot. A total of 44 students from all classes participated in the activity.

On 20th September 2024, **International Peace Day** was celebrated by the unit in the college campus. On this occasion DLLE Volunteers tied a white **Ribbon on a Wrist** as a symbol of Peace, to our Principal, Teaching and Non-teaching staff members and Teachers. A dedicated team of **56** volunteers actively participated and collected surveys contributing to its success and outreach efforts.

Seminar on 'Recycle The Wet Waste Today for Better Tomorrow' organized in collaboration with Green Club and NSS on 14th October, 2024. Resource Person Mr. Chandrashekhar Gade, Rtd., GMT., MTNL Discussed the ecological impacts of wet waste and the benefits of composting and shared insights on effective waste management practices and innovative recycling techniques. Participants expressed appreciation for the informative sessions organized by the Unit.

DLLE Unit along with Red Ribbon Club togetherly **celebrated HIV/AIDS Week** by organizing Quiz competition on **2nd Dec 2024** in which 84 students participated, E Poster Competition on **9th Dec 2024** in which 31 students participated and HIV/AIDS Awareness Session on **11th December 2024** by Mrs. Shubhada Gurav, ICTC Counselor, Mumbai in which 116 students participated. 18 Volunteers participated in the Rally organised by MSASC, Thane.

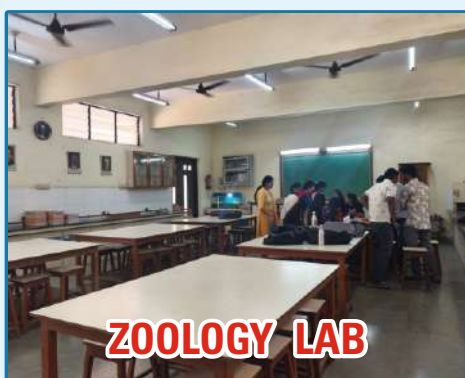
